Europe Plunges into War

Germany was going to have to fight a long war on two fronts Realizing this, the German high command sent thousands of troops from France to aid its forces in the east Meanwhile, the war on the Western Front settled into a stalemate War in the Trenches By early 1915, opposing armies on the Western Front had
